



- Scores finalized during panel meeting. Comments locked 1 day after.
- Comments and scores provided to applicants after panel meeting



- 9) Closing remarks from the Chair
- 10) Adjournment

Panel Meeting

- You should not discuss the applications and your scores with your fellow panelists before the meeting.
- While applicants can't ask you questions, you can question one another.
- O If something seems off, you can ask the chair for clarification.
- All issues and concerns must be addressed during the meeting, not after.
- ② At the end of the panel meeting, all scores are final.

Preparing for the Panel Meeting

- Preliminary scores due 7 days before panel meeting
- Prepare any questions for the applicant
- Have scores and comments printed and available for the teleconference
- All scores 79 and below must include comments to the applicant
- Comments to all applicants are encouraged
