Homelessness



Choose one or more of the following projects to complete. Please keep a record of the total number of hours it takes to complete the individual projects and document the time on your volunteer log sheet. Completed projects are due back to the library by **July 31** along with the completed volunteer log sheet.

Supplies provided in SOS kit: colored pencils, glue, cardstock, paper.



Project 1: Send words of encouragement.

Create cards with words of encouragement for someone experiencing homelessness. Return completed cards to the library with kit.

Supplies Needed: colored pencils, paper, markers (optional)

Project 2: Organize a supply drive.

Collect travel-sized hygiene supplies that can be added to kits and given to people experiencing homelessness. Create a social media campaign to advertise your collection efforts and/or speak to family and friends. You can even ask a local business if you can leave a donation box at their site. Do you have friends that play on travel teams? Chances are they may have unused travel-sized supplies. Return collected supplies to the library with the kit.



Acceptable donations include: travel sized bottles of body wash, hand sanitizer and liquid soap, lip balm, toothbrushes, toothpaste, cans of dry shampoo, bug spray, sun block, flashlights, washcloths, socks, deodorant, individual packs of face and body wipes, ponchos, reusable utility sporks and feminine hygiene products. Items should be new and unopened.

Supplies Needed: varies but may include a collection box, markers, and paper to make flyers



Project 3: Collect bags and backpacks.

Collect gently used or new backpacks, athletic bags and drawstring bags. Reach out to your family, friends and neighbors and collect bags they are no longer using. Make sure they do not have holes or damaged zippers. Return supplies to the library with kit.




Library Services for Youth


