

The Real Florida Reader state park pass is a summer-long program that provides Florida's libraries with park passes to circulate.

Florida public library card holders can check out the Real Florida Reader state park pass at their local library. If you don't have a library card, visit your local public library to get yours today!





Entry into all Florida State Parks is on a first-come, first-served basis. Many parks fill to capacity, especially on weekends and holidays. Day passes do not guarantee park entry upon arrival.

Show the pass at the entrance station of the state park, or at self-pay stations, write "Real Florida Reader" on the envelope and drop it into the deposit slot of the Honor Box, then hang the pass from the rear-view mirror or place on the dashboard of your vehicle.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THIS PASS

- Good for one vehicle (up to eight people).
- Excludes Ellie Schiller Homosassa Springs, Skyway Fishing Pier and Weeki Wachee Springs state parks.
- Does not include camping or any other fees.
- Checkout times and periods vary by library location, and passes must be returned to the same library.
- This pass is only valid from May 21 Sept. 12, 2022.

The Real Florida Reader state park pass will be accepted at most Florida State Parks. Some Florida State Parks require additional fees which are not covered by the pass.

Activity fees or entry into special events, museum or boat tours, rentals of picnic pavilions or equipment such as canoes and kayaks, or overnight camping or lodging are not covered.
